In 2021, the **spring equinox** occurs on **Saturday**, **March 20**. This event marks the astronomical **first day of spring** in the Northern Hemisphere. The word *equinox* comes from the Latin words for "equal night"—*aequus* (equal) and *nox*

(night). On the equinox, the length of day and night is nearly equal in all parts of the world. With the equinox, enjoy the increasing sunlight hours, with earlier dawns and later sunsets.
